Atmospheric Measurement Techniques (AMT) introduces reduced Service Charges

Due to the tremendous efforts of the editorial board, the high quality of the submitted papers as well as the continuous support by referees, authors and the scientific community, AMT was recently indexed in Thomson Reuter's Science Citation Index Expanded (SCIE) including the Web of Science. For early summer 2011 we expect to receive the first journal impact factor.
